



May 19. Fri. 1899.

It rained most of the day. Michiel Ipsen came home in the afternoon from his trip out in the country. Michiel and I visited Sister Karlson on Brudgränd and had lunch with her.

In the evening we went and listened to "Ephraim's daughters". They were two intelligent-looking women, who went from place to place preaching. Their sermons consisted of condemning all religious sects as Anti-Christ. They were followers of Dr. Lee. At the end of the meeting a young man wanted to know how many hungry they had fed and how many

marked they had clothed etc as they spoke about that as the only true Christian life etc. This led to a dispute and a quite a disturbance among those who were believers in their doctrine. We bought some of their literature to get more acquainted with their doctrine.
May 20. Sat.

In the afternoon, Elders Erickson, Ipsen and myself together with Brothers Lundvall and Hult, went to the woods a little outside of town to look at a place where we could have a little party on "2 Day Pungst." We went by the "villen" that Mr. Björklund build for Sister Björklund before she went to Gjern.

In the woods we saw a
hedgehog. It was the first
one I have seen. We took
it in our hands, but it rolled
up like a ball unless we
had left it.

May 21 Sun.

Had an interesting
Sunday School in the morning.
We discussed the subject of the
scattering of Israel. Had
dinner at Sister Fredricka
Andersens. In the afternoon
meeting, Elder Ivers, Erickson
and I spoke. A few strangers
and several Saints present.
A crowd stayed after meeting
and had a good time.
Had supper at Sister
Fredricka's again. Was
cold weather all day.

May 22 Mon.

Had an interesting
meeting at 11 o'clock. Had
dinner at Sotten Ahlströms.
Stayed with them most
of the afternoon. In the
evening, at 7 o'clock, we
held a Sisters meeting.
Several Brethren were
also present and they all
bore their testimony. In the
evening we were invited
to Sister Aker's for supper.
She dressed herself in
men's clothes and
waited on the table
for us. Some sung
songs and had
other amusements dur-
ing the evening.
Was stormy weather all day.

May 23. Tues.

Had breakfast at Bro. Malmbergs, and dinner at Bro. Gustaf Karlsons. In the afternoon we went to Sister Johanna Linqvist and spend the rest of the afternoon. Her daughter Heilma played several pieces on the violin. At 6 o'clock she left Upsala for Stockholm, and we all went with her to the station.

Spent the evening at Bro. J. A. Stalos.

May 24 Wed.

At 11:36 a.m. I left Upsala on the train for Kärgrufvan, where I arrived at 4:30 p.m.

It rained most of

the day. I changed cars at Kyrkby for Kärgrufvan.

At the station I inquired of a young boy the way to Uncle Gustaf Larsons, but soon a young boy came up and I asked me if I was from America, I told him "yes" and asked if this was my cousin Adolf Larsson. He said it was so he went with me to their place, where I was well received. They were out in the field working but came home soon after I arrived.

He spoke about several things concerning America. They seemed to be quite interested in Utah

and the whole evening was spent in talking about things in Utah etc.

May 23 Thurs.

Talked with Aunt Matilda about missionary experiences and several things and agreed to hold a meeting here on Friday evening. Visited a brother to Bro. Roberg in Ogden. He was also in the church and I invited him to come to meeting. At 8 o'clock ^{May 26 Fri.} in the evening I commenced the meeting, about 30 being present. As I couldn't sing I read a song to them. I spoke about 1½ on the first principles of the Gospel. The best of attention was paid and at the close of the meeting.

I distributed some tracts to them. They were all well satisfied and said they would have liked to listened to me longer.

I was very much pleased to have the knowledge of holding a meeting at my Uncle's place, and I think it made a good impression on him as he said afterwards that I spoke about things that were worth thinking about.

May 26 Sat.

At 10.45 a.m. I bid my Uncle and Aunt "Good Bye." My Uncle gave me 5.00 kts. to help me on my mission. He said I was ever welcome back again. My cousin Adolf went with me to the station "Hängruvan". At 11.20 the train

left for Krylbo arriving there
at 12.20 p.m. Here I purchased
a ticket to Hedemora for 95 öre,
and at 1.43 the train left
Krylbo. At Hedemora I bought
a return ticket to Säter for
1.10 kr. At Hedemora the
river "Dalefven" had flooded
over and the water stood
up to the windows of some
of the houses. They say it
hasn't been so high since
1860 when it was a little
higher than now.

I arrived at Säter at
2.55 p.m. and from there
walked to Solvato about
5 miles. Säter is the smallest
town in Sweden having only
about 500 inhabitants.
I arrived at Solvato

about 4.38 p.m. As soon as
I came into town I
went into a house and
asked for the Mormon hall.
The people called my
attention to a lady who
was waving her hand
and told me to go over to
her. I did so. She was
a sister in the church, and
she asked me to stay &
have supper with her and
she would send word to
Elder Edvaldson to come
over. I waited awhile
and Bro. Edvaldson came
and we had supper
there after which we
went to the hall.
Was clear weather but still
quite cold.

May 28. Sun.

Had breakfast with Sister Margreta Larsson, the same sister that we had supper with the night before.

At 11 o'clock we held meeting.

The hall was full with Saints and strangers.

I spoke most of the time.

After meeting I was presented to all the Saints. I also met Sister Anna Lisa Mattson, who was in Eger when I left. She invited us to dinner.

Had Sunday School at 3 o'clock. Several Sunday school children were present. The

19th ch. of Matt. was read and discussed. Had supper at

Sister Hansens, where we also sang many songs.

In the evening we went out walking with Sisters Mary Lind and Anna Johansen. We went out to a fine place in the woods and played all kinds of games. It was a fine clear evening.

May 29. Mon.

Had breakfast at Sister Anna Lisa Mattson and we also visited Sister Carolina Forslund, and had dinner and supper there. Wrote a letter home and also sent my report to Elder Michiel J. Jensen. In the evening Bro. Anders Petersen as well as Sisters Anna Johansen and Mary Lind came to the office. We played several games during the evening having a

good time until quite late
in the evening. It rained
hard at about midnight.

May 30. Tues.

Had breakfast at Sister
Anna Lisa Mattson, after which
I visited Sister Margreta Larsson
bidding her "God Bye." Elder Edval-
son went with to Solveto
station where I got on the
train which left at 9:30 a.m.
Sister Mary Lind stood by the
rail way and waved her
hands as I passed by
in the train. I arrived
at Hedemora at 11:20 a.m.
I went up town and in-
quired for John Rosan,
and soon found him
on Ling gate 24. I went
and presented myself

and was received very kindly
and was treated on a good
dinner. In the afternoon I
went up town, around the
church etc. The "Dakefen"
was flooding over as the
water ~~stood~~ up to the windows
of the buildings. Mr. Rosan
informed me that most
of the money which Erik
Petersen had here had
been sent to him and
only about \$500 was left.
In the evening I had a
good Gospel conversation
with John Rosan's daughter^{3d}
and also got acquainted with his
son, William who was a painter.
He was a member of the
Salvation Army. I received a
little bed room for my self

where I spent the evening.

May 31. Wed.

In the morning I also had a good Gospel conversation with Porsins daughter. Mr. Porsin gave me the money that was left over and I gave him a receipt for the same.

At 10:30 a.m. I left Porsins for his arving thus for about noon.

I first came to Fredrick Åberg's place and from him was directed to his son, Anders, who was married to my cousin Christina. When I came in there only Mr. Åberg and his daughter Ellen was at home. Mr. Åberg was glad to see me, and after waiting awhile his wife (my cousin) came home. She also was glad to see me

They knew I was coming as I had written to them. Mrs. Åberg had been to Aunt Christina and told her that I was coming. The whole day was spent in talking about old times from the deep mother was born in Sweden. In the evening their little daughter Anna ~~was~~ came home from. She is 8 years old and Ellen is 13 years.

They were nice looking girls with black hair and dark blue eyes. Mr. Åberg had about 3 acres land and 6 acres pasture. A nice little house, two cows, a sheep etc. He is a taylor by profession.

June 1st Thurs.

In the morning Aunt Christina came. She was greatly delighted to see me, and a

long time was spent in talking to her about mother and how things were in Utah in general.

After having dinner, she went with me to her place which was some distance from Mr. Åberg. Mr. Åberg bought his place from Mr. Erik Nilsson about 3 years ago for 1100 kr. Bro. Lars Sunderson had land beside Mr. Åberg and we also passed his home in Näs when we went to my Aunt's place. We passed Mr. Erik Andersson's place also and my mother's father's place where I mother passed her childhood years. They called Erik Andersson for "Åthars" here in Sweden. I and Aunt Christina went up a "Husby Skiv" a high hill, where

we could see for up the river "Dalefem" and all the neighboring towns. From this hill we saw the place that Lögren had when they were in Sweden. I was told that he who bought this place had went bankrupt and his wife's brother had bought it. When we came down from this hill, we saw a cafe to my Aunt's house, a little cottage by the hill side. She had it set and clean here and said that in reality she now had her best days.

June 2. Fri.

After having a good breakfast, we went and visited Mr. Gustaf Nordström. Both him and his wife were

acquainted with my mother
and Aunt Christing Stuart.
We stayed here and had
dinner and talked about
things in general in Ulab,
after which we went home
to my aunt's place again.
I went to her in the evening
about baptism and explain-
ed to her the principles of the
Gospel. Wrote a letter to Mother
while I was there.

June 3 Sat.

At 11:45 I left a small station
called "Snickarbo" on the train
for Upsala again. My Aunt
went with me. She gave me
two kr. and paid my ticket
to Krylbo. I didn't arrive
in Upsala until 5:30 p.m.
When I came up to the office.

I found Elders Ipsen and
Fredrick Swalberg there. Elder
Swalberg was on a visit
to his relations, having com-
pleted his mission in Skane.
June 4. Sun.

Had an interesting Sun-
day School. Studied the scattering
of Israel. Had fast meeting
and spoke much about
fasting. In the meeting
in the afternoon we
spoke on the principles of the
Gospel. Only few strangers
present. Elder Swalberg gave
a few Farewell remarks.
Had supper at Sister
Fredricka Anderson.

June 5 Mon.

Elders Ipsen, Swalberg
and I together with

Sister Björklund visited
"Carolina Redviva" and saw
the Old Bible there which was
about 1300 years old. It was
taken from Germany in the
16th century by Gustaf Adolf.
It is written in many millions.
Its binding is of gold silver
and written in pergement
with gold & silver. We also
visited the "Domkyrka" and
afterwards went to see Korpul
Krantz "på Lägeret".

I went to Sister Johanna
in the afternoon with some
photos and got some dinner
from her.

Had a good Sisters
Meeting in the evening.
Much was said about the
"Word of Wisdom".

June 6. Tues.
Elder Fredrick Soalberg
left on the boat at 9:15 a.m.
At 11 o'clock we went to
Sister Åker and administered
to her. Also had dinner.
Spent the evening at Bro. Lund-
qvist. Bro. Lundqvist read
many comical selections
from papers. Had a good time.

June 7. Wed.
While Elder Ipson was out
travelling I wrote several
letters and straightened
up the Acol Books. Had
supper at Sister Fredricka
Andersons.

June 8. Thurs.
I went to Bro. Åkerlund for
dinner. Visited Sister Affertina
Larsen in the afternoon.

Had a good meeting in the evening. Brothers Nylander, Erickson and I spoke. I spoke about my missionary experiences among my relatives.

June 9, Fri.

Bro Lundström together with Sisters Lottie Ahlström her mother and Sister Lundström and Ipsen and myself, went out in the woods near Grundstugan for dinner.

We had a good time, playing several games etc.

In the evening we had supper at Sister Augusta Westrup, by invitation of Bro. Lundström.

June 10, Sat.

At about noon Elder A. C. Pearson arrived direct from

Quin. He was from Fay Lov-ville, Utah. As he was born in Utah he was unable to speak Swedish. He is 28 years old. Had been teaching 7 years in Utah. Sister Björklund gave us a kv. to get a dinner for. In the evening we had supper at Sister Getterqvist.

June 11, Sun.

Got up at 8 o'clock in the morning and went to the woods together with several Saints to hear the "Coco," but we got fooled. We had a good time, however, had a little lunch at the "Asylum."

Had Sunday as usual ^{and} a good attendance. Wen

invited to Sister Augusta
Westring's for dinner.

The afternoon meeting was
not very good attended,
only one stranger and
not many Larits. In
the evening we ate a
lunch given to us by
Bro. Kato. Had a long
promenade in Flustret.
Met Sister Björklund there.

June 12 Mon.

We were called to go
and administer to Bro.
Johan Ojerf's boy, who was
sick with some skin
disease. Had dinner
at Sister Akers. Spent
the afternoon in writing.

June 13 Tues.

Was cold and miserable all

day. We were all in, at the
office all day, as there was
nothing particular to do.

June 14 Wed.

Had breakfast at a
restaurant. At 11:35 we
and I, left for Almnage
on the train. From Almnage,
went next to Bro.
J. Osthund, where we got
a good dinner. Stayed
there all night.

June 15 Thurs.

Left Bro. Osthund after
breakfast, and went to Mrs.
Valk in Täppan. She gave
me some boiled milk. She
was faith in the Gospel.
Got to Bro. A. P. Andersson's in
Tomten. Had dinner there,
after which we went Bro. G. B.

Jansam in Batmanly. Stayed there over night.

June 16 Fri.

After breakfast I went to Bro. Friedrich Sobbe in Fasteine. He and his wife went with to Bro. J.E. Jansson's place, where we held a good meeting. Several strangers were present.

June 17 Sat.

We went to Bro. F. Sobbe's place and had a meeting there at night. Several were present. I spoke on the "God head." Stayed with Bro. Sobbe all night.

June 18 Sun.

We had a fine breakfast of fish etc at Bro. Sobbe's after

which we went to Bro. J.E. Jansson's. Had dinner there and then went to Bro. J. Ostlund's. Here we held a grand meeting at 4 o'clock. About 100 persons were present. It was out doors, but we and as many could get in, were in an old barn shed, which was cleaned and decorated with birch limbs. After meeting we distributed tracts to the strangers present. There were several there who had faith in the Gospel, and who, undoubtedly, soon will in the Church.

After meeting we had a fine supper of fish etc. It was a warm and pleasant day. Had a real pleasant weekend.

June 19, Mon.

After having a good breakfast and dinner, we left for Almnings and got on the train for Upsala, arriving there at about 3 o'clock. When we got up to the office, we found Bro. Pearson here, studying his Swedish bible. I had a letter from John Sjogren and G. A. Tingsen at the office.

June 20 Tues.

Sent in several names of Saints who had died, into the "Northstar" Sister Theresa Henriksen from Stockholm came and visited us

June 21 Wed.

Elder Michael Spason left for his relations over, he should

spend mid-summer. Elder W. Erickson left for a trip out in the country to sell tracts. Had supper at Sister Fredricka Andersens.

June 22 Thurs.

Elder A. Pearson and I went and looked at the old cannon at the Upsala Castle. Had meeting in the evening. Only 5 Saints present. We agreed to have a little feast on mid-summer. We went with Sister Theresa Henriksen for a little promenade after meeting.

June 23 Fri.

Went to the boat to see Sister Theresa Henriksen off for Stockholm. Decorated the office with green limbs etc, as it was midsummer eve.

I visited several of the Saints and arranged with them to go out in the woods on midsummer. Had supper at Bro. Gustaf Carlsson on Bredgränd. Elder Erickson came home.

June 24 Sat.

We had breakfast at Bro. J. A. Kato. Was cold and unpleasant weather for mid-summer. Several Sunday School children gathered at the hall and at about 10'clock we went to the woods and stayed there and played games of different kinds until evening when we all went up to the hall and had some refreshments etc. after which we again played several games and had a very good time. There were also some non-Mormon children

present, who were enrolled in the Sunday school.

Had supper on the hall to gather with Sister Fredricka and Emma.

June 25 Sun.

Had a fine and interesting Sunday School. Bro. Lingren from Steckholm was present. Had dinner at Sister Fredricka Andersens. Had an interesting meeting, although not many Saints were present. Bro. A. A. Lundvall and I spoke. We went down to Bro. Lundvalls in the evening. Had lunch there, after which we went and saw the midsummer pole, which was dressed with flags and guns etc.

June 26. Mon.

Broder Jos. Björklund came up and visited us a short time. If we had had time we would have went with him out sailing. We had dinner at Sister Westrings and in the afternoon we went, together with several Saints and hired a boat, and rowed a ways down the river and went to a hillside where there was lots of woods and stayed a few hours. We had lots to eat and drink and played several games. We were 17 in the boat. On our way back we sang songs etc. In the evening we had Relief Society and several Sisters

were present. This was an unusual fine day.

June 27. Tues.

Sisters Thersa Henrickson & Augusta Bergqvist came & visited us on the hall. Had supper at Bro. A.A. Lundevalls

June 28. Wed.

At about 11 o'clock we all went to Gamla Upsala and stayed at the depot, until Sisters Björklund, Thersa Henrickson and Augusta Bergqvist, and another young lady from Upsala. They arrived on the train at 11.38, after which we immediately went to where Sister Hedvig Nyander lives and stayed in a little shady place there and had a little lunch etc.

We then went upon the Gamla
Upsala mounds, there Odens,
Thor and Frey is said to be
buried. We were also in
the old church there, which
was build on the 11 century.

At this place an old heathen
temple has also stood. The
remains of King Erik was
once laying in under
the floor of this church. They
had at present an old image
of Christ, which they had
worshipped, in heathen times
Old bibles from the 13 and 16
centuries were also shown
us, together with an old
Stredby chair which were
used in older times.
We also drank Myd from
horns and spent some

of the time in singing
and playing etc. At about
7 o'clock we all left and

July 2. Sun.

Had a good Sunday

at Bro. J. A. Kato's place.

There was not many
present at meeting for
account of the great de-
monstrations in town
by the "Temperance societies"
Had supper at Sister
Fredricka's.

July 10. Mon.

After having breakfast
at the hall, we went to
Bro. J. A. Kato's awhile after-
which I went and in-
formed several of
the Saints about our
Sunday School fest. Had
dinner at Bro. J. A. Kato's
after which we went with
him to the photographer as
he got a photo taken with
his flowers on. At about 4
o'clock we started with the

children to the woods at
a place agreed upon, called
"Sölgrenska villan". We took
with us "summer drinks
and food of different kind
and had a jolly good
time, playing all kinds
of games with the children
and eating and drinking
to our hearts content.

We kept on until about
10 o'clock in the evening,
when we closed with
prayer and went home.
We had lots of cakes over
which they gaped us.

In the evening when we
went to bed, Gus were
good and tired, having
been and played with the
children all afternoon.

July 7th Tues.

We were tired after having
run with the Sunday school
children the day before. In
the afternoon Sister Anderson
from Stockholm came up and
told us to come and administer
to Sister Lotte Ahlström who
was sick. An hour afterwards
we went and administered to
her, and also gave her
a letter from Gion. This
made her feel much better,
as it was from her old friend
Teckla Eklund. Late in the
evening, Bro. Michael Ohren
came home from his trip
to Sigtuna.

July 12th Wed.

I wrote a letter home and
in the evening we all

went out to "Flustret" and listened to the music for a short time. They played a Danish National air and also an American waltz time. It was about 26° in the shade that day.

July 13 Thurs.

We purchased a fine dinner at the "cafe" for a change. Received two letters from home. Had an interesting meeting in the evening. I read Bro. W. R. Carlstrom's letter from Zion to the Saints, which they highly appreciated.

July 14 Fri.

Spent the day in studying, and went down to the "Flustret" and heard the music.

July 15 Sat.

Wrote several letters and did some office work.

July 16 Sun.

Had an interesting conversation Sunday School.

The Captain of the Salvation Army and also a Lieut. was present. In the theological class we discussed the gathering of Israel, referring to the different passages of the Bible which treated on the same. They were very interested and followed us closely in our discussion. When I explained the chart about the travels of Paul, they seemed to be especially

interested. Had dinner at
Sister Fredricka Anderson's.

At 3 o'clock I went to Bro.
Lynde walls with the intention
of meeting Bro. P. E. Eklund
there, but I was disappoint-
ed, as he didn't come.

The meeting was well
attended. Elder Michael Sporn
spoke first after which I
spoke on the Atainment
A fine lady by name of
Frya Mellgren was present
at the meeting. I got intro-
duced to her and she seem-
ed to be much pleased
with her visit and the
sermon. The following con-
versation followed.

"Mrs Mellgren." I thank you very
much for the explanations

the you have given of the scriptures
J.E. I am pleased to hear that you
are satisfied with them. Please
call again.

"Mrs. Mellgren." I shall be pleased

ing of joining the church.

July 18. Tues.

At about 2 o'clock Elder.
Mathias Ericsson came from
his trip to Södermanland. Elder
Ipsen had left in the morn-
ing. In the evening Elder
Ericsson and I went to
see Bro. Ekblund who ack-
nowledged that he had violated
the 6th commandment, and
there fore wished to be ex-
communicated until he

could marry the women, and then he would join the church again. We then went to Bro. A. P. Karlson in Luthagen for supper. Had a good time there telling about missionary experiences.

July 19. Wed.

Bro. Erickson and I went and hunted up a Sister who lived in Börje galan 9, whose parents Bro. Erickson had visited when in Eskilstuna.

July 20. Thurs.

Bro. Ipsen came home from his trip to the country. We had an interesting meeting in the evening. Several Savills and two

Strangers being present.

July 21. Fri.

Elders Erickson and I started for a trip out to the country. Pres. Chas. Forsberg from Göteborg came for a short visit. We met him at the station at 11:10 a.m. He had many regards from Göteborg to me. We went around town and visited the Belmor, University, Castle and other places, also went to Bro. John E. Erickson and had a small lunch and at 2 o'clock p.m. he left for Horndal. Bro. Pleurs and I visited Bro. John Herifs, but he

wasn't at home, so we
stayed with his wife
a while. Sister Ellen Åker
was there also.

July 22 Sat.

Bro. Pearson and
I went to Bro. Corlans
on Brodgränd and had
supper there.

July 23 Sun.

The Sunday school was
well attended. Several
strangers being present,
among which were Frim
Mellgren. We took the
subject of "Articles of Faith"
for discussion in our
Theological class. After
Sunday school we went
to Sister Malinberg and
Åker and had some

thing to eat at each place.
It was Sister Åker's name day.
In the afternoon meeting
Frim Mellgren came about
~~20~~ minutes before time and
said that she had a young
lady with her who could
play the organ. She sat
down and played a
few songs which we
agreed upon to sing
at meeting. We were
quite pleased to have
good music in our
meeting, and little
did we expect that we
would get a nice young
lady like her to play
for us. We had 5 strangers
present, and of these 4
promised to come again.

In the evening we
went to Sister Fredricka
Andersens' for supper.

Sister Anna Olav was
there. She spoke about
how interested Fr.
Mellgren was in our
doctrine, and that she
especially liked our
Sunday school.

July 24. Mon.

This is Pioneer Day in
Utah, but not in Sweden.
We fasted until noon when
we went to the Cafe for
dinner. In the evening we
went to Sister Lottie Ahl-
ströms. She was sick in
bed so we administered
to her. Had supper there.

July 25. Tues.

Sister Björklund came up
to see us and gave us books.
Herman Wallin from Fästerna
called and wanted us to
come and hold meeting
at his place next Sunday
which we promised to
do. Herman Wallin was
excommunicated from the
church last Spring for drunk-
enness, but he had repented
now, so he wished to
come in the church again.
He treated us on coffee and
dip. In the evening we
went to Bro. Skotis and
had supper there.

July 26. Wed.

We fasted until noon when
we went to Bro. Åkerlinds
to visit them. Sister Åkerlind

was washing, but she took
time to prepare some dinner
for us. Bro. Pearson noticed
that she spit on the plates
when she washed them
and also washed the
bucket that she brought
milk in, in the water
she had washed clothes
in. This made his little
stomach weak so he
couldn't eat much, but
I never noticed this so
I ate a good meal.

Poverty and filthiness
is bad when they are
combined.

In the afternoon we went
to Sister Gutterqvist and
cut wood for her as she
was always home.

I cut until I got hard
blisters in my hand.
After we had cut some wood
we were invited in for
supper. As it was her
daughter Martha's namesday,
they had a cake prepared
with her name on.
Sister Åker and Ellen
were there. In the evening
we went down to
Flassträt to see the Bell-
man celebration. They were
going to have Bellman
in fire and some fire-
works. Hundreds of people
were present but the fire-
works was a snake
affair, and Bellman is
~~there~~ wasn't much to see.
It lasted only about 20 min.

July 27. Thurs.

We were at the office and studied etc. all day. In the evening we had an interesting meeting. Several Saints and some strangers being present.

July 28. Fri.

Received word that Elder John Felt was going to visit us on Sunday. We had dinner at Sister Anna M. Johansen. We had supper at Sister Fredricka Andersons.

July 29. Sat.

We went up to Sister Lotte Ahlström just before we went down to visit Elder Felt into the docks. He came at 8 o'clock.

and we then went up to Lotte Ahlström and had a small lunch, and at 7:15 p.m. I left on the train for Smithy. I arrived there at nearly 10 o'clock and had to walk about 5 miles before I got to ~~Bittern~~ where Bro. John Jansen lives. I got there at about 11:30. Sister Jansen was up, and I was well received. Bro Jansen was in bed, but he got up when I came, and they prepared some supper for me.

July 30. Sun.

At about 9 o'clock we left in a spring wagon

for Rimbo, where Mr. Wallen lived, where we should hold our meeting at 11 o'clock. It was a pleasant morning, and a cool breeze was blowing from the west which made quite delightful to ride. We arrived at Mr. Wallen's place at about 11:30, and after having some refreshments we started our meeting. About 30 or 40 strangers being present. I gave a thorough explanation of the 1st prin of the Gospel, speaking about 1 1/2 hr. There were about a dozen religion people present, such as Baptists etc. They were very

religious, and were greatly interested in my sermon, as they acknowledged that my remarks were according to scriptures. No Mormon Elder has spoken in this locality for about 10 years, so Mormonism was new doctrine to most of them. After meeting I sold several tracts and conversed with the people. After the people had gone we had dinner and for desert strawberries and milk. About 4 o'clock in the evening we left Mr. Wallen and went to Bro. Frederick Sobk and had coffee and lunch there after which we again drove back to Bro. Jansen

in Båmanby, where I stayed all night. Mr. Waller was with me and we spoke a whole lot about the principles of the Gospel.

July 31st Mon.

At 11⁰ clock a.m. I left Båmanby, and started for Skutby station. On my way ate strawberries and nearly got to late for the train, which arrived at 12:52 p.m. I arrived at Uppsala at 2:56 p.m. and Elders Felt and Pearson was there to meet me. I had a letter from Elder Ison at the office containing their monthly report and an order for books & tracts. We went to Sister Ahers

for dinner and stayed there most of the afternoon. In the evening we had Sister Relief Society. Several Sisters were there and a real good spirit was present. After meeting we agreed to go boat riding the next night.

Aug 1st Tues.

We had dinner at Sister Fredricka Andersens, & in the afternoon I and Elder Felt visited Sister Anna M. Johansen and she treated us in "Svenskt @". We then engaged some boats for the evening. At 7⁰ clock we had supper at Bro. Kato's and we

ate crawfish there for
the first time in our life.

At about 8.30 we all got
in two row boats, about
16 persons. We rowed a
ways up Fyrisån and
then stopped at a fine place
where we had refreshments
and played several games
singing songs etc.

At 10.30 we rowed back
again

Aug 2nd Wed

Elder Felt and I visited
Sister Zetterqvist, and at
noon we all went to
Bro. P. P. Karlens in Erikland
Had a fine dinner there.

In the afternoon we were
at Sister Lotte Ahlström
and in the evening

we visited Bro. Lindvall
Had a fine meal of green
peas there.

Aug 3rd Thurs.

Had dinner at Sister Lovise
Munters, and in the after-
noon we went to Sister
Hilda Sjäder and got treated
on coffee and biscuits.

In the evening we
had a fine meeting.

Several Saints being
present, Elder Felt gave
his farewell speech.

After meeting we sang
several songs etc. for
some Saints never went
home until about 11 o'clock.

Aug. 4th Fri.

In the morning we went
and ate breakfast at a Café

At 9:15 the boat left for
Stockholm on which
Elder Felt left. Several
Saints were at the docks
to see him go. In the
afternoon Elder Pearson
and I went and had
a bath.

Aug 5th Sat.

I received a couple of
letters from home.
In the evening we were
invited to Sister Westring's
for supper. Had a good
time there.

Aug 6, Sun.

Had a real interesting
Sunday School. The subject
of the Godhead was discussed.
After Sunday school we
administered to Sister

Lingvist, who was affected with
a swelling in the neck.

The fast meeting was well
attended and all the
Saints bore a good
testimony. The meeting
in the afternoon was
well attended and Bro
Stato and I occupied
the time. In the testimony
meeting Bro. A. C. Pearson
bore his testimony in
Swedish for the first
time.

In the evening we were
invited to Sister Fredricka
Andersens for supper,
which we appreciated
as we had fasted all
day. Had a real good
time there.

Aug 7th Mon.

Bought breakfast and dinner, I copied minutes in the record book. In the evening I went to Sister Fredricka Andersens for supper. Sister Anna Olson treated.

Aug 8. Tues.

In the afternoon at 3 o'clock, I was invited to see Frw. Mellgren. She lived on Waksalagatan 26. She treated me on coffee and lunch. He spoke on religion nearly all the time. She was favorably impressed with our doctrine, but something such as revelation etc. she wouldn't believe.

I showed her our temple and other buildings in Utah which she was favorably impressed with. She said if she wasn't so old she would go to Utah and be a Mormon.

Aug 9. Wed.

Bought dinner at Café as usual. Took a walk to Flustret, saw the fish in the Swanedam etc. Wrote a letter home. Heard the band at Flustret.

Aug. 10. Thurs.

In the evening we had an interesting meeting. Several Saints were present. I spoke on Church history.

Aug 11. Fra.

In the morning, Mr. Wallin from Eastern came up to the office. He treated me on coffee & lunch. In the afternoon Elders Ipsen and Erickson, from their trip to Eagle ^{camp}. At 8 o'clock we held an extra council meeting for the purpose of admitting Mr. Wallin into the church. Mr. Wallin in a humble manner, asked forgiveness for his wrong doings & asked to be admitted as a member again. This was unanimously adopted by all. He slept with us on the hall that evening.

Aug 12 Sat

Mr. Wallin is a tailor, so Elder A. C. Pearson and I ordered a suit of clothes each from him. He took measure of us before he left in the morning. He treated me to a lunch. Had dinner at Cafe. Coming from the cafe we met Mr. Wallin again. He had not got his bicycle repaired yet, so he was waiting for that. He treated us to a lunch again. In the evening, Elder Ipsen and I went to Bro. Stab's and Elders Erickson and Lepson to Fredrick's.

Aug 13. Sun.

The Sunday School was interesting as usual. The theological class discussed the God head. For a general lesson the school was questioned on Abraham and the offering of his son Isaac.

After Sunday school all four of us got a letter each from home.

I got a letter from Alfred Stuart, stating that he had sent me \$20 as a present. Sister Björklund gave us

1.5 kr for dinner. The afternoon meeting was well attended. Elder Ipson, Erickson and

I occupied the time.

After meeting we practiced singing for a while, in order to get acquainted with ~~what~~ music in the notebook.

We got three good songs for next Sunday as it was District meeting then and Pres. O. J. Sandberg will be present.

After meeting we all went to Bro. A. A. Lunderall for supper.

I spoke to Bro. Lunderall about decorating the hall a little for District meeting, and Bro. Lunderall promised to get some flowers etc.

Aug 14. Mon.

Sister Carolina Lindvall came and gave us money for to get a meal at the Heafe's which we did. Had Sisters meeting in the evening.

Aug 15. Tues.

I received \$95 from Alfred Stuart, and also a letter from Annis Thomas. Elder Matthias Erickson and I had dinner at Sister Karlsons on Bredgård.

Aug ^{Wed} 16. Wrote a letter to Alfred Stuart and at 9:15 we all left on Fyris II for Skokloster driving there at about 11 o'clock. Elder Erickson went to Stockholm while Elders

Ipson, Pearson and I stayed at Skokloster and got a guard to show us all the curiosities found there. The relics there were valued at 2,000,000 kr. We saw two cubboards or desks containing jewelry valued at 1,000,000 kr each.

On the walls were scenes representing Alexander the Great in several of his battles, woven in cloth. It was the largest collection of Alexander views of that kind in the world. This castle was built by N. G. Trangel, in the 16th century. It took us about 2 hours to go thorough it all.

They had the largest collection of guns in the world, that is private collection.

Swords and daggers that kings have used, clothes etc used by Royalty and other old relics were found there.

We went back on S.S. Nyas Upsala, and got to Upsala at about 3.20 p.m. Sister Augusta Westring was on the boat. She was not feeling well so we helped her pack her basket to her home. We went to Sister Fredricka for dinner and to Sister Westrings for supper. We administered to Sister Westring as she was ill.

Aug 17. Thurs.

We went to Cafe for dinner and then we went to the docks to meet Elder M. Erickson who was going to come from Stockholm, but got left, as he didn't come. Elder Olson and I went to "Statsparken" and stayed awhile, during the afternoon. Had meeting in the evening. Rained all night.

Aug 18 Fri.

Elder M. Erickson came from Stockholm and we met him at the docks. Went to Flustret in the evening.

Aug 19. Sat.

Decorated the hall for
Distriktsmöte. Pres. P. J.
Sandberg came in the
evening. Several Saints
were ~~at~~ the hall decor-
ating.

Aug. 20. Sun.

At the Sunday we
reorganized the församling
electing Bro. J. A. Kato,
Supt. and Brothers A. A.
Lundvall and A. P.
Carlsen his counselors.
Pres. Sandberg spoke to
the Sunday school.
Sisters Esth Anderson
and ^{came}
from Stockholm. They
were good singers, so
they came as good
help for us.

Had dinner at the "Cafe"
Had "Sysskin församling"
at 2 o'clock. All the
Saints bore their testimony.
Bro. P. J. Sandberg gave
some good advice to
the Saints.

At 3 o'clock p.m. the hall
was full of people. I
spoke a few minutes
and Pres. P. J. Sandberg
occupied the rest of
the time. He delivered
a fine speech. The
Sisters from Stockholm were
home in the evening
and several of the Saints
went with them to the
station.

Had a fine supper
at Bro. J. A. Kato's.

Aug 21, Mon.

Bro Sandberg was with us and we had dinner at "Cafe" as usual. In the afternoon Bro Sandberg went home to Stockholm.

Aug 22 Tues.

Bro Ole Pearson and I left Upsala at 11:35 a.m. on the train for Alnänge. From Alnänge we walked to Bro Ostlund's and stayed with them all night. We rowed over a small lake in the evening to get Bro Ostlund, who came from work.

Aug 23, Wed.

After having breakfast, we left for Bro A.P. Andersson at Tomte. Had dinner there, and then went to Bro Johan E. Jansson in the evening.

Aug 24 Thurs.

After having breakfast at Bro Jansson's, we left for Mr. Wallin in Tjörns, where we held a meeting that evening. We also had the privilege of baptizing Mr. Wallin. He fitted our clothes on us, which he is making.

Aug 25, Fri.

We stayed at Bro Wallin all day until about 3 o'clock when Bro.

Haller's went with us
to Bro. F. Sohle, where
we had a meeting
that evening. Several
were present I sold
several tracts.

Aug 26 Sat.

We stayed at Bro.
Sohle all day. We
and seen how they
thrashed grain and
also how they plowed.
In the evening we

we stayed full night.

After having lunch
and dinner, we left

Aug 30 Wed.

Went to Sister Munters

for dinner and then
we went and took
a sweat bath. Went
to Bro. Sundevall and
got a lunch and
some berries there.
Shortly after our
arrival at the hall
Elders Leapsu and
Munson from Dal
arna came on their
way to Stockholm.
Went to Flustrikt in
the evening and
heard the music.

Aug 31. Thurs.
Had breakfast at the
hall. The meeting in
the evening was quite
interesting. Elders Munson
and Carlson spoke

Sept. 1st Fri.

At 9:15 we all left on
the boat "Fyriska" for Stock-
holm. Had a pleasant
journey. The Saints
paid for our fare \$1.50.
We arrived at Stockholm

Carlson met us at the
harbor. Bro. Carlson from
Årbo was also there to
meet us. We then went

our (Michael Spenn and I)
farewell and Elder Garff's
reception. We drank
chokolade and played
all kinds of games
until about 12 o'clock.
Several Saints were present
and we had a real
good time. Elders Spenn,
Garff and I spoke
a short time.

Elders Leppan and Munn
came from Stockholm so
we were 9 missionaries
now present.

Sept. 9 Sat.

Had a little breakfast
on the hall. At noon
Elder Garff and I went
to Bro. Malmberg for
dinner. After supper at
Bro. Skatens. Elder Axel
Modéen left for Luleå
at 7 o'clock. We went with
him to station. Elder Munn
also left for Dalarna.

Sept. 10 Sun.

Had an interesting
Sunday school. I took
charge of the theological
class. After Sunday school
we held sacrament meeting

Frø Mellgren was present
and had friben played
for us. Elder Leason
spoke most of the
time. We were invited
to Sister Emma Åker for
dinner. Had an inter-
esting meeting in the
afternoon. Elders Ipsen
and I spoke. Were invited
to Sister Getterqvist for
supper.

Sept. 11 Mon.

Went down to Bro. Fund-
wall in the morning.
He gave us some fruit
and treated us for coffee
and lunch. At 11.20
we left Uppsala on the
train for Vesterås. Sev-
eral Saints were on

the station to see us off.
We changed cars at Sala
and also at Tällberg.
and got to Vesterås at
about 3 o'clock. Elder
Lefgren, Erickson, Blom-
qvist met us at the
station. We went to Freds-
gård 54, Normalen. where
we stayed all night.
The Elders in Vesterås,
stays with a family of
Saints by name of Johnson.
were the first to arrive.
I wrote a letter home that
night.

Sept. 12 Tues.

John Lefgren and I visited
Vesterås estate and also
saw the place where Erik
~~the~~ XIV was chained and

where he walked in
a circular path, inclosed
with 12 stones. We also
visited "Jakeni bergen"
where writings of all kinds
were found on the stones.
We visited Fru Kunnal
Liljedal, sister to Sister
Grundin in Salt Lake
city. She lived in a little
room with her daughter
and son. We were well
received there, treated in
coffee and lunch and
invited to come
again. We also visited
Mr. Hallgrans of Ogden,
Grandfather. In the
evening we were six
Elders staying at the
hall in Vestris. Elder

Söderlund came back from
a trip to the country.
Wed, Sept. 13.

After breakfast in the
morning, Elder Liljgren
and I left Vestris for
some Sprints out in the
country. After walking
about 2 hours we
got to Bro. Jägerholm in
Wängsta where we had
dinner. We then went
to Bro. Sandbergs
where we stayed that
night. We arranged for
a meeting and John
Liljgren and I went and
invited the people to
meeting. At 8:35 we
started. A large crowd
was present and good

attention was paid by
all present, We arrang-
ed by a meeting at
another place for next
night. We sung and
talked some after meet-
ing.

Sept. 14. Thurs.

We stayed at Bro. Sandbergs
all day and in the evening
we held a meeting at Bro.
Sedels about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from
Bro. Sandbergs. A few stran-
gers were present. It was
dark and rainy going
back to Bro. Sandbergs
again.

Sept. 15. Fri.

After breakfast again we
left Bro. Sandbergs and
stopped for Sura Hammar

to visit my cousin Emma
Strandberg. It rained
hard all day and we
got wet in going
through the woods.
We stopped at Klockartorps
and here the lady in-
vited to some milk
and bread. Their little
girl went with us
a little ways to show
us the way through the
woods, but we got lost
any how and drifted
of on old cow trails
and it rained terribly.
Finally after we were
quite safe we got to
a little farm house
beside a little lake.
As they didn't have any

at home to get across
on, we were obliged to
try and hunt our way
around the lake. Here
we also got lost and
wandered around until
we finally got to a
barn, where we got
onto a road that led
to Sura Hammar. We
went to Mr. G. C. when
we found my cousin
Erzuma Strandberg.
She knew who I was as
soon as I said I had
regards from her mother
in Hednora. The
first thing I asked for
was some dry socks
as we were both wet
through. She gave us

some dry socks and
shoes, which I well ap-
preciated as we were
quite wet and chilly.
In the evening my
husband came home.
He is a blacksmith and
works at the factories.
We were well received
and spent the evening
in talking and looking
at views from America
and Utah.

Sept. 16, Sat.

In the morning I
had the privilege of ex-
plaining the principles
of the gospel to her,
and for now I also
spoke to Mr Strandberg
about Mormonism. He

got quite interested, and
would have liked to
hear us preach if
there had been any chance
of holding any meeting
in the neighborhood
but this was impossible
as the factory companies
owned all the land and
houses in the neighbor-
hood and they refused
all preaching outside of
their own religion. I
left some tracts with
him which he well
appreciated. At about
2:30 we left Svanham-
mar and walked
around by Hallsta
Hammar, back to Vångsta
about $2\frac{1}{2}$ Sw. Miles. We got

to Vångsta in the evening
when we got well re-
vived as usual.

Sept. 17 Sun.

We stayed at Bro. Sand-
bergs all day. We were go-
ing to hold a meeting at
the Temperance hall in
Lilla Harad socken, but we
received word that we
couldn't get it, so we
were disappointed
in this expectation. It
ruined all day.

Sept. 18 Mon.

In the morning we
left for Vesterås. It rained
partly. We stayed at
Bro. Jagersholm and had
a little lunch there, after
which we started for

Vesterås in rain and
snow. We finally got
to Vesterås wet and muddy.
I had a letter from home
when I came to Freds-
gatan 34 where we stayed.
Sept. 17. Thurs.

We stayed in Vesterås
all day, and arranged
for leaving the next day.
We wrote letters etc.

Sept. 20 Wed.

At 10.48 we left Vesterås
for Skultuna, which cost
80 ore. Here we got off
and walked to Stentorp
when Elder Lefgrens grand-
mother and aunt lived.
It rained all day. We
stayed here all night.
Mr. Rostling was acquainted

with my father when he was
here in Sweden.

Sept. 21 Thurs.

We left Stentorp at about
11 o'clock and got to Söndå
station at 11.48 where
we took the train for
Kärngrufvan which cost
about 79.90 each. We got
to Kärngrufvan at about
2 o'clock and then we
got off and went on
to my Uncle Gustaf
Larsons. When we came
there no one was home,
but after waiting a while
~~my~~ Annar came and she
welcomes us and pre-
pared something for us
to eat and let us
have as good as a home.

Sept. 22. Fri.

It was fine weather in the morning and in the forenoon we sat outside and herded my Uncle's cow while my aunt prepared food for us. She also went down ^{and} saw the mines that were dug. They went down many hundred feet into the earth. This is a great Iron country and large iron mines are found all over.

In the evening we had an interesting meeting at my Uncle's. Several strangers came and were quite interested and after meeting we sold several tracts.

It rained hard after meeting, and my uncle went with some folks and helped carry their children. After he came home we stayed up until about 11 o'clock talking about different things.

Sept. 23. Sat.

At about 11:20 a.m. we left Kärrgruvan. Uncle Gustaf gave me 5.00 kr. before I went. It rained hard all day. The ticket from Kärrgruvan cost 80öre. to Krylbo. At Krylbo we bought tickets to Hedemora which cost 95öre and at Hedemora we bought return tickets to Säter which cost ^{kr.} 1.00. When we got to Säter it

it rained hard but we started out for Seward about $\frac{1}{2}$ day's mile. At Sister Larsons we stopped awhile and had a little lunch after which we went to the hall where we met Elder E. W. Edvalson. We then went and visited Sister Matson, who used to be his neighbor to Lefgrens in Utah, and had supper there.

Sept. 24 Sun.

At 11 o'clock, we held a meeting. The hall was full, even a Temperance preacher present. I and Elder E. W. Edvalson were the speakers. After meeting it was agreed upon to leave another

meeting at 3 o'clock.

We all went to Sister Larsons for dinner. At 3 o'clock the hall was full again. Elders J. P. Lefgren, Mrs. Munsen and Bohman were the speakers. After meeting, it was announced that a photographer would be here on Monday and all who wanted to have their faces on a picture on a photo should be present in the morning. It was also agreed to have a fest Monday evening. The evening was spent at Sister Hansens or "Soups" as they are called. We had supper there

and spent the rest of
the time in playing
games of different kinds.
Sept. 25 Mon.

It was all invited
to Sister ^{Heide's} ~~Matsons~~ for breakfast.
After breakfast we stayed
at Sister Hansens awhile.
We had dinner at Sister
Matsons. In the afternoon
I wrote a letter to two
ministers asking for genealogy.
In the evening preparations
were being made for
the fest in the evening.
They prepared about a
bushel of potatoes which
we helped to peel. These
were boiled and made
into mush and we
ate them together with

"lingon" pork and bread ^{and}
butter. They dealt out small
slips of wood to all, which
had a letter on, and
those who had two letters
alike were partners for
the evening and had
to eat on the same plate.
I was lucky to get a
nice young lady who
ate with me.

After we had eaten all
we wanted, we prepared
for playing games of
different kinds until
about 2 o'clock in the
night.

Sept. 26 Tues.

We got breakfast at the
hall (which some Saints
prepared for us). It intends

to take the first train
for Säter, but changed
our mind and stayed
until about noon,
when we walked to
Säter together with Elder
Eedvalson who also left
for Stockholm. Sister
Pema Hansen and one
of Sister Larssons daughters
went with us a little
ways. We got on the
train at Säter about 11:43
a.m., and John Lefgren and
I got off at Hedemora.
We went direct up to
Johan Rosins, and left
our grip there and then
we went and hunted
up Anders Andersons, brother
to Johan Andersson in Ögden.

We found him home and
we were well received.
He lives alone with a young
lady to keep house for him.
We were treated on a hunch
and talked much about
Utah etc. He also informed
us about a lady who lived
next neighbor, who was
sister with Lars Andersons
wife. We went in and
were treated for by her Mrs
Klemmarström, who was
glad to see us and hear
from her sister. She also
treated us on a hunch.
We then went back to
Johan Rosins where I
met Johanna Hedström
who was a good friend to
Aunt Christofz Sjöström.

In the evening we stayed
at a hotel which cost us
\$1.50 for both.

Sept. 27 Wed.

After getting some coffee
and a pinch, we started
out for Väsa about $\frac{1}{2}$ Sw. mile
from Hedemora. We stayed
for a while at Fredrick Åberg's a
little while, and then we
started for Anders Åberg
who was married to my
cousin. We met them on
our way there, going out
to dig potatoes. My cousin
gave me ~~my~~ the key and
we went ~~to~~ their house
and got in and stayed
until my cousin came
back with some fresh
potatoes and prepared a

dinner for us. In the
afternoon John Sefgren
and I went to the
place where my mother
lived while she was
a child. The lady who
lived there asked us to
call next night, which we
promised to do. On our
way back we went in
to a tailor place in the
neighborhood and talked
awhile until it got quite
dark and on our way
back we got awfully
muddy as it was dark
and we couldn't see
where we went.

Sept. 28. Thurs.

After eating breakfast
at Åberg's, we had their

"Good Bye" and left
for Biskopsbo where John
Lefgren was born. On our
way we visited a sister
to Mrs Lars Anderson.
We went to a place called
Strömers where the folks
were well acquainted with
both my mother and
John Lefgren's parents. After
we had stayed there a while
we went down to Biskops-
bo and saw John Lefgren's
birth place. The visible
neighbors around there
who were well acquainted
with Lefgren. Sundstedt
a neighbor near by was
well pleased to see us, and
we spoke much about
the principles of the gospel

Anders in Biskopsbo and his
father were nearest neighbors
to Lefgren. We conversed
a while with them and
were also treated on coffee
prepared by Anders, but
it was the toughest cup of
coffee I ever drank. We
then went back to Strömers
where we had a good
meal and then we went
to Skamsen in the evening.
John Anderson from
Strömers and his wife
came over and we
spent the whole evening
until quite late in
talking about Utah and
America, and we also
spoke about the principles
of the Gospel, which

seemed to interest them all, and when they left I gave them several books to read for further information if they desired to get on.

Sept. 29 Fri.

We received a good breakfast here at St Hansen, and then we left to visit some other acquaintances to our folks. I had now had the privilege to stay at my mother's old home in Sweden. We visited the old woman at Buskbo, who brought of from Erick Andersons, and called the folks at Jurgas Anders, where we drank coffee.

They were all pleased to see us and sent their best regards to our folks.

We then went to my Aunt at Erikmatbo, where we were well received.

Here we stayed all day. In the evening an old lady who they called "Krat-mor" called and conversed with us. She was greatly surprised to see us, especially John Lefgren, whose parents she well remembered, as they were her neighbors here in Sweden.

Sept. 30 Sat.

At about 10:30 a.m. we left my Aunt's place and walked to "Bruckarbo" the nearest station, where

we got on the train
and rode to Rosshyttan
which cost 93. in.

From Rosshyttan we
walked to John Lefgren
Uncle's place, a distance
of $\frac{3}{4}$ of Sw. mile. Bro.
Anders Holmgren is a member
of the Church. We got
here in the afternoon
and stayed all day.
This was an unusual
fine day. Bro.
didn't come home until
late in the evening.

Sun. Oct. 1st

It rained hard all
day. Bro Holmgren was
acquainted with an
Aunt and Uncle of
mine, who lived in

this neighborhood. He
was well acquainted
with my father while
he was in Sweden. We
stayed in at Bro Holm-
gren all day.

Sept. 2nd Mon.

After breakfast John Lef-
gren and I visited left
Bro. Holmgren in Nötmarken
and I started for my Aunt
place in Lella Bjurfors. On
our way we stayed in
at a family who was re-
lated to Elder E. V. Ed-
valson. We had coffee and
lunch there. John
Lefgren then left for his
relations and I for
mine. On my way I
went in to a school house

and inquired of the school
teacher if she could tell
me where my Uncle
Anders Lundegvist
lived. She gave me the
necessary information
and we walked a mile
away and then went
into a red farm house
and inquired. The
lady of the house gave
me the necessary infor-
mation and upon in-
quiring about Anders
Lundegvist I told them
that I was related to
them and then they call-
ed a girl who was
my Uncle's daughter. She
was working for them.
As she says my

cousin they excused her to
go with me home to her
place, which was a long
way through the woods.
Mr. Nilsons, the man who she
worked for and I conversed
some about Utah and
I showed him views from
Salt Lake City & Washington.
My cousin Emma then
went with me home to
her place. When I came
home there and went
into the house and ask-
ed my Aunt if she knew
who I was, she only
looked at me and
shook her head. When
I told her I was her
brother John's oldest son
she got awfully surpris-
ed.

After a while my Uncle
came home. He would
scarcely believe when
I told her who I was.
In the evening my cousin
Gustaf Lundqvist ^{and}
his wife came over
in the evening and
we spoke and con-
versed all night
about Utah and America.
When we left I was
asked to dismiss by
prayer which I did
and after I prayed,
my cousin also prayed
and thanked God for
our happy meeting.
My Uncle and Aunt have
lived here 3 years. They
rent the house from Mr

Thoren who had a large
farm, and my Uncle
works for him although
he is 73 years old. He goes
out in hard work every
day. My Aunt is 10 years
older than my father,
nearly 70 years old. Before
they moved here they lived
at the old house that my
grandfather and grand-
mother use to live in just
before they moved to Utah.
Oct 31 Tues.

My Uncle and I visited
the old house that my father
owned and lived in together
with my grand parents.
Stenmaber Hells son Gustaf
lives there now. He went in
the house, so I got to see it

inside. Mr. Nilson came to my Uncle after we came back, and we had a long conversation about Faith and Bobbin which was quite interesting. My cousin Emma and I then went to visit my cousin Gustaf where we stayed for dinner. He is married and has eight children all alive. He works for a "Herrgård" called Bjursfors owned by Högfors Bruk, and gets 1.25 kr. Wages and free rooms, fire wood etc. Tille Bjursfors is owned by Gustaf Hellgrön who lived in my father's old place and rents the rest out

for 350 kr a year to a Taylor by name of Wilhelm Johanson. After having dinner at my cousin I and Emma started Karr burning to visit my cousin Josefina who is married to Erik Låsen, who came from Hedemora. On our way there we stopped at Kliding Bohmen, where Gustaf's oldest daughter ^{Josefine} is married. Her husband, Anders Forsberg works at this place for Gustaf Korkström, the youngest son to the Korkström who owned it while my father was here. Gustaf's oldest son Frans also works here and gets 260 kr a year.

When we got to Lösen in Hökmo, my cousin was taking bread and we stayed there entire evening. They had just moved here in April and had rented a farm of nearly 50 acres and spent just 8.50 a year rent and all expenses. He had to buy all things to start with so he was in a large debt. He has 6 children living and one dead. His oldest son is 18 years old, and works out.

On our way from Hökmo we stopped at Fosbergs and had supper, and on

our way back from there we had to go in the dark by the assistance of a lantern. We finally got to my Uncle's place. My Aunt was quite anxious about how it would go for me, as it was so dark. It rained in the evening. Uncle had been out looking for me with a lantern!

Oct 4, Wed.

After breakfast, I prepared for leaving my Aunt's place, and before I left I was asked to offer up a few words of prayer to the Lord, which I did. My cousin Emma went with me a long ways

to show me the road. I called in at Per Erik Persen in Hedaker an old friend to my father while he was in Sweden. He is now a well-to-do farmer, and also a Baptist. I first came in and introduced myself as the old son to John Groberg and had regards from him to Per Erik Persen. There was only a woman in the house, who I supposed was his wife. She asked me if I was a Mormon and I told her "Yes" and then she seemed to have no more interest in me. Finally Per Erik Persen came in together with

another man, but as they didn't say anything I had to introduce myself again and Per Erik Persen acknowledged me by acknowledging that he was well acquainted with my father, but did not seem to care about my father's conversation so after they had eaten their dinner I left for Rosshyttan and took the 3.20 p.m. train for Krylles, and from there I bought a return ticket to Snickarås and went up to my Aunt's place, but when I came there she wasn't home, so I had to go to my cousin's place and I overtook her on the road

She was quite surprised to see me again and after I had come to Aberg with her and stayed there awhile we went back to Erikmat-
sld again and my Aunt prepared supper for me which I well appreciate as I hadn't had any since morning and had walked about 15 miles.

Oct 3. Thurs.

I left Erikmat's in a morning in time to catch the 11:30 train and at Knytt I bought a ticket to Hordal. I got there at about 2:15 P.M. at Hordal I inquired for Finnes, where my Uncle Erich Larson lived.

A Railroad man knew about it and I was directed to go to "Grönsika" first and then get further information. On my way I called in at a store and bought some candy. A lady clerk was there and told me that I had about 15 miles to where my Uncle lived. I finally got to "Grönsika" where my Uncle used to work. Here I called in at a place and inquired for the route to Finnes. The lady I spoke to was well acquainted with my Uncle. I finally got to where my Uncle lived about 7 o'clock in the evening.

but then I was tired.

They were quite surprised in seeing me and I was well received. He had a son and daughter home.

Oct 6. Fri.

I spoke a whole lot to my Aunt about Mormonism and she was well pleased with all my doctrine. My Uncle works in a Blacksmith shop not far from the house part of the time, and I was out and looked at him part of the day.

Oct 7. Sat.

I stayed with my Uncle all day and we conversed about Utah and the principles of the Gospel.

Oct 8 Sun.

In the morning I went with my Cousins to the Baptist meeting. The preacher took his text from Hebrews 4th. and in connection with that spoke about the wondering of the children of Israel from Egypt.

In the afternoon I went with my Uncle through the buildings of the scire mill paper Flour Mill where he was machinist. In the evening we all went to a meeting in the Baptist church for young people. They had excellent music and the preacher gave a fine talk from scripture.

In the evening after meeting I had the privilege of discussing the personality of Gott with my Uncle and Aunt - and they acknowledged that I was right.

Oct 9 Mon.

I left Finnes at about 8:30 a.m. My Uncle went with me a long ways on my way, and gave me a brown and a pair of rubbers. I walked to Hopudal which is about $2\frac{1}{2}$ Sw. miles from Finnes. The train left Hopudal at 2:10 p.m. for Upsala. I had return ticket to Kryllo and there I bought a ticket to Upsala for 3.80 kr.

I got to Upsala at 5:10 p.m. and met Elders Garff and Pearson on my way to the Hall. In the evening I met several Saints from the country. The Sisters had meeting in the evening and we had an interesting time. Brothers Kratz and Jansen from the country were present.

Oct 10 Tues.

Several Brethren from the country called at the office. We prepared a breakfast ourselves at the hall. Next we went to the "Marknad" and had dinner at Sister Fredrika Anderson. In the even-

any we went and saw
the different curiosities to
be seen at the "Marknad"
I went to Sister Fredrickas
and had some supper
there.

Oct-11. Wed.

We prepared a fine break-
fast at the hall. Elder C. B.
Garff and I visited the
Pethoptiken which was
quite interesting. We
visited Sister Anna M.
Johanson and were
invited to stay for dinner.
~~We~~ spent the evening
at Bro. Gustaf Karlens who
invited us all for supper.
Elder Garff had his man-
dolin with and we
had a good time.

Oct-12 Thurs

Had a breakfast at the hall, worked
at a private report of my
missionary work in Uppsala.
Had an interesting meeting
in the evening. I spoke
some about my experi-
ence among my relations.

Oct. 13 Fri.

It rained hard all day.
I was invited to Sister
Akers for dinner, and in
the evening we were
all invited there and
had a real good time.

Oct 14 Sat.

Being rainy weather we
stayed in all day and
in the evening five
were all invited to Bro.
A. P. Karlens for supper.

Oct. 13. Sun.

Had a fine Sunday School. Elder Garff conducted the Theological class and the subject of "Sin" was discussed. We all had dinner at Sister Fredricka Andersens, and after dinner took a walk to the cemetery. We had a large meeting in the evening. I spoke most of the time giving my farewell speech to the Saints. Elder Garff spoke a few minutes after words. In the evening we had supper by invitation of Sister Anna Alsen & Sister Fredricka Andersens.

Oct. 16. Mon.

We had breakfast at the hall, after which Elder Garff and I visited Sister Lubia Munder and upon her request we stayed for dinner. We then went and got a "Stadsbud" to take my trunk to the boat in the morning, after which we visited Mrs. Wangelinis and were treated to a lunch. At 6 o'clock we went to Sister Lotten Allström for supper. A young lady by name of Augustas Persen treated. When we came back there was lots of Saints at the hall preparing for the "fest" in the evening. As this was my last

night in Sweden,
it was to be my "fare-
well fest" and lots of
Saints were present.
Chocolate and cake was
served for all present.

After this Sister Björklund
stood up and presented me
with a fine new album
which the Saints had bought
and presented to me, and
I was asked to come
forward and receive the
same. After I had done
so I thanked the Saints
for the good will shown
towards me in present-
ing me such a present.
It was indeed, surprising
for me to receive a
fine photograph album

as a memory from the
Saints of Uppsala. We had
many good games and
plays during the evening,
and at about 12 o'clock we
dismissed. After all had
went I placed all ~~the~~ my
photos in the album.

Oct. 17. Tues.

At 8 o'clock the "Stadsbud"
came and took my
trunk to the boat. I
went a bid Sister Lund-
vall farewell and re-
ceived some apples to eat
on my trip. We had a
breakfast at Br. Gustaf
Karlens in Bredgränd, ^{NY}
I received some lunch ^{NY}
"saft" from Sister Anna Olin.
We then went down to

The boat several Saints
were there to bid me
"God Bye" and at 9:15 a.m.
the boat left and I left
Upsala for the last time.
I got up the upper deck and
waved my handkerchief
as long as I could see
any one in sight. On
the boat were not many
passengers, but when I
looked around a Sister
Fengberg was on board.
She came from the country
two miles from Upsala.
It was cold and miserable
on the boat, so it wasn't
such a pleasant trip. At
3 o'clock we got to Stockholm
and Pres. A. M. Anderson
and Elder J. W. Cannon

was and met me at the
docks. I got a "Stadsbud" to
take my trunk and valise
to Hornsgatan 80 and then
I walked with Elders Ander-
son and Cannon to the
hall. We all went and took
a bath in the evening and
then went to Sister Lindes
where we had an elegant
supper. Several Saints were
present and we had a
real good time. Bro. Lindes
is a shoemaker and his
wife runs a little store.

Oct. 18 Wed.

Had breakfast at the hall. At
12 o'clock we started for ~~dinner~~
Lilla Holmen, where we were
invited for dinner at Bro.
Lindgrens. Bro Lindgren

is a baker and has a bakery at his home. We stayed there most of the afternoon and had a little lunch before we left. When we came back I went to visit Helma Lingvist at Kummakaregatan 89. 3 tr. up, but she was not at home. I went back to the hall again and there I met Bro. Sandberg från Wangsta, in Westmanland.

Elder Cannon had an exercise in singing with the choir. Several members of the choir were present. I wrote a letter home. It was quite cold all day.

Oct. 19. Thurs.

Had breakfast at the hall. At about noon we went to "Sabbatsberg sjukhus" and seen a Bro. Eklund who had been there sick with consumption. Afterwards we went to the poor house to hunt up a Sister Johanson, who has a daughter in Uta. We were directed into the sick department and found there, after much hunting an old lady by this name. She said she had a daughter in America, or rather had said so when she could talk, now she was unable to talk. As no one else there was present who had this name we of course thought this was the lady.

When we told her that I had seen her daughter she cried and when we asked her if we should give her regards back to her daughter again she also cried but finally nodded her head. Upon inquiring we found she ~~had~~ ^{was} not the right woman, as this Sister Johansen was in another department.

We then went to Sister Sandbergs for dinner, and had a good time there.

We then went back to the hall. I went and visited Bro. Bergelius before meeting. We started meeting at 8:30 p.m. I spoke a short time to the Saints about my missionary

experiences in Sweden. Elders Cannon and Anderson spoke the remainder of the time.

Oct. 20 Fri.

Had breakfast at the hall. Elders Anderson and Cannon went and got the Stars from the station, while I stayed at the office and wrote. Went to Bro. Bergelius and had a lunch there, also wrote a letter for him to the Pastors exposition in Kalmar.

We went to Bro. A. F. Strand for dinner. Here I blessed a child two months old by name of Knut Elis Strand born 25th of July.

In the afternoon we visited

Sister Ester Anderson on
Neornsqalan 81. We had some
lunch there and had a
real good time.

In the evening Elder J. G.
Cannon started an English
school and about 120
young men and ladies
were present, mostly Saints.
Sister Anna Swanson and
Ester Anderson wanted me
to stay until Tuesday so as
to be present at a little
party they had they were
going to have then, but
as I had promised to
go to Orebo by Sunday I
could not comply with
this invitation.

Oct 21. Sat.

Got up at 6 o'clock. Ate break

fast at the hall and at
8 o'clock I left Stockholm
for Orebo. Elders A. M.

Anderson J. G. Cannon and
Sister Anna Swanson
were with me at the station.
About 11 o'clock I got to
Vesterås and got off there
to hunt up Elder J. P. Löfgren.
I went to Hamngården 16
road Sister Albertina Larsson
lives, and found Elder
Söderström and Bro Sandberg
there, but J. P. Löfgren was
out in the country. sent
word with Bro Sandberg to
him and wrote a little
note stating my errand.
Elders Erikson and Ipsen
came to Sister Larsson
after a while and I went

with them to the station
as they were going to go for
a trip out for the country.
At 8:18 p.m. I left Vesterås
for Örebro. Sister Larsson
met me at the station a
little while before I left.

The trip on this train was not
very enjoyable as it was
Sat. night and then all
the working men were
going home and had liquor
with them so nearly all were
drunk.

I got to Örebro at 7:47 p.m.
and Elder C. R. Erickson
and Brother Larsson and
Axel Thedell met me at
the station. We went di-
rect to the hall and from
there to Bro. Quistbergs men

we had a good supper.
Oct. 22. Sun.

At 11 o'clock we had a
meeting. several strangers
and fine Saints were
present. I spoke some of
the time and Elders
O. A. Blomqvist and Erik-
son spoke the remain-
der of the time.

At noon we were all
invited out to Bro. Lar-
sson for dinner. Sister
Thedell were there and
helped to prepare it. It
was a fine dinner which
we all enjoyed.

At 3:30 hrs held a Sun-
day school at the hall and
at 5 o'clock our meeting
commenced. I spoke

all the time explaining
the first principles of the Gospel
and also the resurrection.

Jobs of Saints and several
Strangers were present.

In the evening we were
all invited to Bro. Olsons
for supper and had a
real good time there.

Several other Saints were
also present and we
played games etc all even-
ing.

Oct. 23 Mon.

Sister Erica Larsson
came in the morning ^{and}
treated us on Spanish (ropus)
and Apples which were
much appreciated. At
noon we were all invited
to Bro Olson the Blacksmith.

for dinner. Sister Thedell
was there also and we
stayed a part of the afternoon.
Got a letter from J. P. Lofgren
stating that he was going
to Spelborg also. Spent the
evening at the hall. Bought
some bread and butter etc
for supper.

Oct. 24 Tues.

It was cold and miserable
all day. Elder L. R. Erickson
and I visited Bro Axel
Thedell and his mother. We
invited to dinner there.
Sister Irene Larsson and
Ellen Mellin were at the hall
in the evening and we
sang songs etc.

Oct 25 Wed.

We were all invited

to Sister Melius for breakfast. Elder Erickson and I went to Sister Schölds were we stayed a little while. The evening we spent at Bro. Larsons Elders C. R. Erickson, L. O. Blomquist and myself together with Theodors were present. We played games and had a real good time. Arrangements were made for a fest on Thursday evening.

Oct. 26, Thurs.

Elder C. R. Erickson² & I went to Bro. Emil Theodors for breakfast. Bro. Erik Carlsson invited us all to a cup of chocolate and cake at a fine "Konditorie"

At 2:54 p.m. we all went with to the station as Bro. Erik Carlsson intended to leave for America, but he didn't come, so we were obliged to return without seeing Bro. Carlsson. It was quite cold being over 1° freezing below.

We all were invited to Bro. Lundequist, who has above the hall, for supper. At 8 o'clock the Societies commenced gathering at the hall and at 9 o'clock we started our "fest." A fine crowd were present and we all had chocolate and lunch after which we played games of different kinds. Bro. Erik Carlsson

bid all the Saints fare-
well as he left on the train
for Göteborg at 11:55 p.m.

We went down to the
Southern station and waved
our hats at him as he passed.
At about 10 o'clock we closed
our "fest" and I thanked
the Spiess for the last time
for their goodness toward
me.

Oct. 27. Fri.

We ate ~~supper~~ breakfast
and dinner at the hall.
At about 3 o'clock Elder O.
Blomqvist and I left
Orebro for Göteborg. The
tickets cost 11:35 kr. Several
Saints were at the station
to see us off, and as the
train left we waved

our handkerchiefs as long
as we could see any one.

We stopped at Heallberg
nearly an hour waiting
for the train from Sjöde-
holm. At about 10 o'clock
p.m. we arrived at Göteborg.
All the Elders in Göteborg,
Pres. G.E. Forsberg, John Jalkanen
and Lewis Erickson to-
gether with about 15-
Saints were at the
station to meet me.
It was indeed, pleasing
to see old friends and
acquaintances again from
my old field of Galva
which I left some 14
months ago. I had
the honor to stay with
Bro. Nils Söderberg and

have a home there while I was in Sweden. I had a fine supper then before I went to bed.

Oct. 28 Sat.

Had breakfast at Bro. Söderbergs and then went to the hall on Plantagegatan 13. It is a fine hall lighted with ~~Electricity~~ gas and nicely ornamented.

We all went to Bro. Nat.

Johansen for dinner and had a real good meal on "Skåder" a kind of fish.

In the evening we all went to Krogslas for to attend a meeting which we should hold there. We were 13 who went with and the young

Saints had guitars with which they played upon and sang. A large crowd was present and we had a real good time. I spoke part of the time and Bro. Forsberg the remainder of the time. When I came back from Krogslas it was about 11:30 o'clock.

I had supper at Bro. Söderbergs before I went to bed.

Oct. 29 Sun.

Had breakfast at Bro. Söderbergs and then went to Sunday school which started at 10 o'clock. A large attendance was present about 54 souls.

They had 5 classes and good order. After the class exercises I spoke a short time.

to the children, and after
Sunday School had the
pleasure of seeing several
old Saputs and friends.
We were all invited to
Bro. Julius for dinner and
had a little talk with
Bro. Julius in regard to
our temporal affairs.
At 4 o'clock we started
the afternoon meeting.
Lots of Saints and stran-
gers were present. I spoke
about an hour and Elder
D. Blomquist and Bro.
Nils Söderberg spoke the
remainder of the time.
After meeting I had
the pleasure of again
seeing many more
Saputs and friends.

In the evening were all
invited to Bro. Schylander
~~and~~ Sister Elvira
treated Soci of Saints
were present and we
had a real good time
singing songs, reciting,
etc. etc.

Oct. 30. Mon.

After having breakfast at
Bro. Söderbergs I went to the
hall and wrote a letter home.
We all went to Bro. Lorentz
Anderssons on Bangatan 28
for dinner. After dinner
Elder John Johnson and I
went and visited Sister
Matilda Bergman. We
saw the fine "kukelungus"
which she was making
or rather painting.

We then visited Sister Haglund and were treated to Hållensgård. Sister Haglund hasn't been in the school long as owns a fine house.

We then went to Sister John for supper. All the Elders were there and we had a good time.

Oct. 31. Tues.

After having breakfast at Bro. Söderberg's I went to the hall. Wrote some letters and then we all went to Bro. Hansons for dinner. Met Sally Pettersen there. After dinner Pres. Forsberg and I visited Sister Johansen in Lundala. Bro. Andreas Johanson was out working so we didn't get to see him. On our way back we visited we visited Sister Therin a

short time, but as we could not stay long, we were invited back again next Friday.

We then went to the hall and shaved and prepared for the fest at Bro. Hansons in the evening. It was Sister Hansons Birthday and also a little social for myself, which Bro. Hansson had prepared for.

Lots of Saints were present and we had a real good time, playing games and eating and drinking. At the close Bro. Söderberg expressed the kind wishes to Sister Hansson who was 41 years of age. Bro. Hansson expressed his good wishes towards me, and Pres. Forsberg closed by prayer.

We than all went to our
homes feeling pleased with
the good time we had
had.

Nov. 7. Wed.

After having breakfast at
Bro. Söderbergs I went to the
hall, and at about 12:51 clock
we left for Brokslätt for
dinner at Bro. Jacobsons.

On our way back I went in
to Bro. Juhlius and stayed
there awhile eating a little
lunch together with them.

The evening we spent at
Bro. Schylander and had
a good time. Fröken Ellen
Göthenberg treated us all
to supper. She isn't in
the church yet but has
full faith and does

all she can for the Elders.
We played games and enjoy-
ed ourselves fine.

Nov. 2 Thurs.

Had breakfast at Bro.
Söderbergs, and then went
to the hall and made
out some of my missionary
reports. Elder J. P. Löfgren
came from Vesterås in
the morning and Elder
Albert Johanson came from
Keelsingborg. We all went
to Bro. Söderbergs for dinner.
After dinner Elder John Johanson
and I went to see Bro. Wron
and here we were treated
on wine etc. He then went
to Sisbi Eloisa Lyrell
and Ellen Göthenberg was
there also. We got chocolate

and lunch there, and we stayed until nearly time for meeting in the evening. We were seven missionaries present that evening. Elders Albert Johnson, J. P. Larson, D. Blomqvist and myself spoke. Several Salvation Army girls were present. After meeting I bid the Saints Good Bye, and then went to Bro. Nils Söderberg and had a little supper and went to bed.

Nov. 3rd Fri.

Elder John Johnson and I went to Peterson at the Sugar factory in the morning, as Mrs. Peterson wanted to send regards to her

daughter Anna in Italy, who immigrated some over a year ago. We left there at 12 o'clock after having a good conversation about the Gospel.

We went to Sister Haglund for dinner at 1:30 and stayed there awhile. Had singing practice in the evening, and after practice I found the other Elders went to Sister Julius for supper. Had a good time there.

Nov. 4 Sat.

After having breakfast at Bro. Söderberg's, I went to Bro. Hedberg and had the "Good Bye". He spared me over that came before I went. We all went to Bro. Nat. Johnson

for dinner, and from there
Elder John Johnson and I
visited Sister Helena And-
erson. A Salvation Army girl
by name of Ellen Alden was
present. We drank chocolate
and had a real good
time. I then went
back to the hall and got
my things and went to
Rev. Söderbergs and packed
up. Got supper at Rev.
Söderberg and then at about
9:30 we all left for the
station. Elders J. P. Fjällgren
Dagda Blomquist and I
left on the train for Copen-
hagen at 10:30 p.m.
Several Saints were at
the station to bid us
"God Bye". We rode on

the train all night.

Nov. 8: Sun.

We got to Helsingborg at 8:30
a.m. Here we got on a ferry
boat to Helsingör. Elder John
Anderson in Helsingborg came
down to the ferry and met
us. At Helsingör we took
the train again for Copenha-
gen, where we arrived at
about 8:15 a.m. From here we
walked to the headquarters
at St. Paulsgade 14 where
met Pres. Andreas Peterson
and Elder Fernström. Elder
Fernström directed us to hotel
Scandia where we met Pres
P. J. Sandberg and the Saints from
Stockholm, Bergelius and Ed-
lunds. We got a room here
at the hotel and stayed and

rested ourselves some as we
didn't have any rest the night
before. In the afternoon at
about 5 o'clock we all met
at the hall in Copenhagen
at St Petersgade 48. As we had
to hunt our way there we had
a hard time to find out where
the hall was, but finally succeeded
in finding it just in time to
arrive at the opening hymn.
Elder Müller Jensen from Copen-
hagen spoke first and made
a farewell speech to the Saints
in Copenhagen which he had
been laboring among for
20 months. I was then called
upon to speak 15 minutes
giving my missionary ex-
periences. Pres. P. J. Sandberg
then spoke 15 minutes, after

which the choir sang a song.
Pres. Andreas Peterat then spoke
the remainder of the time upon
the good work done by the released
missionaries. After meeting
we walked around town
a while and got a lunch and
then we went to the hotel
and stayed all night.
Nov. 6. Mon.

We slept until quite late
resting up since last night.
At about noon we went down
to the docks and helped to
ropes up the trunks and baggage
there, after which we got a
dinner and went to the
hotel again. At about 4:30
the Agent came and gave
us our tickets, and at about
6:30 we all got in cabs

and rode from the hotel
down to the station. At
about 8 o'clock we left Copenhagen.
Lots of Saints from
Copenhagen was off the sta-
tion to bid us Good Byes.
Finally we got to Lange Belt and
here we got on a ferry which took
us to Nyborg. We arrived here
about midnight and at
Fredericia we crossed the
Little Belt, and went to Es-
bjerg where we arrived at
about 5 o'clock in the
morning.

Tues. Nov. 7.

We stayed at Esbjerg at
until noon. At 6 o'clock
in the morning we
had breakfast. We walked
up town a while and

bought a pocket glass and
comb. This was a real nice
town and has a good
harbor. At about 11 o'clock
the Dr. came and he
stamped all our tickets
after looking us in the eyes.
This was to certify that we
were all well. At 12 o'clock
we got on board of S. S.
Express. Several passengers
who went on Dominion
Line were here also. We
were several missionaries
present from Scandinavia.
At Esbjerg a family of Saints
got on board. At 1 o'clock p.m. we left
Esbjerg and started for
Grimsby England. At
2:30, we had dinner, but

it was so stormy that I didn't enjoy it as well as I ought to have done. In the evening the storm increased and those peculiar feelings increased also, until I finally got real sea sick for about 6 o'clock in the evening, and remained so all night.

Nov 8, Wed.

It was stormy and bad weather all day. I stayed in bed and didn't eat anything only a piece of bread and butter and some beef tea. Elders Selgran and Blomqvist tried to go up but got sick and ~~tried~~ vomited so

they had to go to bed again. All the passengers were sick and even our waiter was sea sick although she had been on the sea for five years.

Nov. 9 Thurs.

At 11 o'clock a.m. we got to Grimsby, but didn't get off the boat until about 16 o'clock. At 7 o'clock p.m. we left Grimsby on the train. We got in a car that was billed right through for Glasgow.

At Retford the passengers on the Dominion Line went on a different train to Liverpool and we started north up through York, New Castle on the Tyne.

Warwick, and Edinburgh
At Edinburgh we saw the
old castle on the rocky
cliffs. We stayed here about
15 minutes, and left at
4 o'clock. All along the
road we saw large
turnip fields and herds of
sheep grazing upon them
at different places. We
got to Glasgow at about
3:20 and was met here
by our agent and pre-
siding Elder at Glasgow
Bro. Hunter. He appointed
Bro. P. J. Sandberg presiding
over the company of 66
Saints and Effes, and
Bro. Sandberg then called
me to be his assistant.
The S.S. Anchoria had

already left Glasgow at
2 o'clock P.M. so we took
the train to Greenwich and
here we got on a ferry
boat to where the S.S.
Anchoria was anchored.
We were the greater our
different rooms to lay
in and after having
supper we went to bed.
Nov. 10 Fri.

When I got up and had
breakfast, I went on deck.
We had only traveled a few
miles and had now
anchored near the coast
of Ireland at Moville
waiting for Irish passen-
gers to arrive.
I steamed away at 2 o'clock
in the afternoon and towards

evening it commenced blowing. I stayed on deck as long as the captain would allow us and then we were obliged to go down and go to bed.

Nov. 11. Sat.

It stormed all day. Nearly every body sick. It was too stormy to be on deck so we were obliged to either walk around in the dining hall or else lay in our beds. On account of the stormy weather we only traveled 20 miles.

Nov. 12. Sun.

Got up at 7 o'clock. Had a good breakfast. Went on deck awhile, until a large wave splashed over deck

and I got a little wet. Went down to my hut and laid a read most of the time. Had a fine Sunday dinner consisting of chicken soup, fowl, etc.

Went on board awhile after dinner but was obliged to go to bed again as a man came up and nearly put me through. After tea we sang several songs and spent the evening in a pleasing way. We traveled 170 miles.

Mon. Nov. 13. Mon.

It did not storm so much and the passengers began to get over their sea-sickness. It was too cold to be on deck

much. At about noon, Sister Petersen from Denmark gave birth to a baby girl, which caused a quite an excitement among the passengers. The Doc on board was present and everything went well.

We traveled 220 miles in an almost westerly direction. The tables commenced to be full at the meals, and every body seemed to get a better appetite. The steerage passengers played a bag pipe on board in the evening, and they sang several Scotch songs.

Nov. 14. Tues.

Got up at 7 o'clock and had a good breakfast. Stayed on deck awhile as the weather was quite favorable. While we were eating dinner a large wave caused a side lift to the ship which caused all the dishes and plates to be thrown on the floor. My plate was thrown against the wall and broke all to pieces. Stayed in and read all day and went to bed at about 10 o'clock. We traveled 273 M.

Nov. 15. Wed.

I woke up in the morning by the sound of chains, stools etc turning up side down by the side motion of the ship. At about 7 o'clock a.m. the

table was set for breakfast, when a sudden tip of the ship caused all the plates, knives, etc to be thrown on the floor. Pieces of bread, biscuits, plates etc came rolling into the room where I was staying. When we ate breakfast we were obliged to sit and hold the plate in one hand and be ready to hold onto either the table or the chair with the other. With much trouble we finally eat breakfast without any serious trouble. Towards noon it got a little better and when we ate dinner it was quite good. We traveled 210 miles, which was quite good considering the storm.

Nov. 16 Thurs.

It was quite favorable weather all day and we traveled 268 miles. It was too cold to be on deck much. Sat in and read most of the time. In the evening we had a concert consisting of songs and recitations etc. Had a real good time.

Nov. 17 Fri.

Was real fine weather all day, but towards evening it commenced being a little rocky. We traveled 292 miles and was on deck a lot of the time. When I went to bed, the ship was quite seasick.

Nov. 18 Sat.

When I awoke in the

morning it was quite a storm and the ocean was quite uneasy tossing the boat about. Awfully. It was so bad that some could be on deck, so we were obliged to spend the time in reading etc. A life boat was reported being carried away by the waves. It got a little better towards evening.

Nov. 19 Sun.

The weather was quite nice all day. Had an excellent Sunday dinner of chicken etc. Stayed on board awhile in the evening as the weather was unusually fine.

Nov. 20 Mon.

It was nice and calm in the morning and everybody enjoyed themselves, but towards evening it commenced rolling and got quite miserable. I refused to sleep in the afternoon and slept so that I missed my supper of gruel which we usually get. Saw some ships etc.

Nov. 21 Tues.

In the morning it rolled and was cruel and miserable. Saw several ships etc. Everybody felt quite well as they knew this was the last day on board on "Arcturion".

Nov. 22, Wed.

When I awoke about 4 o'clock in the morning we found ourselves in the harbor of New York. We anchored at Fort Hamilton quire about 9 o'clock. The Dr. came on board here to watch examine the stowage passengers, and after awhile the government officers came and we all had to tell our object in sailing to America and tell how much money we had.

At about 10 o'clock we got off the steamboat and then we had to have our baggage examined

and then we went to the ferry station crossing the East river at about 4:30 p.m. In New York we bought a lunch basket and filled it with food for our trip across the continent. At about 6 o'clock in the evening we left on the Habash Route for Chicago. We got a fine chair car, but I didn't sleep much as I had the headache all night.

Nov. 23rd. Thurs.
It took all night to cross the state of New York. We passed the city of Oswego, where there was a change of conductors, and porters. In the morning when

we came to Niagara Falls,
we stopped 20 minutes
for breakfast; then we
started again, we crossed
the suspension bridge
across the Niagara river
and saw the falls above
us and the swift rapids
below us. It was only
a few minutes over
the bridge, but
during that time every
eye was cast out over
the water, wondering at
the grandeur of this scene.
In a few minutes we were
over into Ontario and there
was seen nothing scarcely
but grain fields. We were
all day in traveling through
Ontario and in the afternoon

now we got to Detroit
the cars were run onto
a large ferry and we
were taken across the
river into Michigan. It
was to be noted in crossing
on the ferry that some of
the passengers thought
we were standing still,
and would not believe
otherwise until they
saw us move in another
town. We then continued
our journey to Chicago
arrived there at 9:30
p.m. At Chicago we
took the Amibus to the
Chicago and Alton station
where we stayed until
11:30 p.m. I got a fine supper
dinner at Chicago before

we left. We then got
on the train and ran
to Bloomington Ill, where
they ran bus off and we
stayed until morning
when we started out for
Knox City.

Nov. 24 Fri.

We passed Ill. and
Missouri, crossing the Missouri
and Mississippi rivers. Just
before we came into Knox-
city we passed Indi-
pendence. There was
scarcely any station there
and the town was away
from the station. The Electric
lights could be seen in
the distance. Our train
was about an hour late,
but the train for Denver

waited for us, and we
scarcely had time to get
on the train until it
started. The Saints filled
one car up and we
finally got into another
which but rested quite
well until morning.

Nov. 25 Sat.

We passed Missouri and
went into Colorado and
at noon got to Denver.
At Denver we stayed
until 3:20 in the evening.
Had a fine dinner there
for 25 cents. I went with
some Saints around
town met a Swedish
policeman and were
directed up to the "Swed-
ish correspondent" office.

when we bought some
hoppers. We then hunted
up a Swedish store where
we bought some grub
for our trip. At 3:20 we
left in a special train
for Salt Lake City.

At Cheyenne we changed
cars and had to wait
about an hour and a half.
During the night we
were traveling through
Wyoming. The mountainous
country was a strange sight
for the Saints who had never
seen mountains before.

At about 3 o'clock we were
in Ogden. As none of
our relations knew about
our coming there, no one
was to meet us.

Nov. 26 Sun.

After saying "Good Bye" to
all the Saints and Elders
we walked up town and
got on the street car
to Five Points and went
up to Bro. Lefgren's place.
When we came there, we
met my brother Charles
and Elmer Lefgren.
Bro and Sister Lefgren ^{were}
at the meeting, and when
they came home again
they were surprised by
seeing us back. Several
girls came ~~back~~ to see
us, and in the even-
ing we went to the Y. M. M.
J. A. Johnson, Elder Jos. Grout,
spoke. He had also the
privilege of saying a few
words. I stayed with

Bro. Lefgrens that night.
Nov. 27 Mon.

In the morning we
went to the station and
got our baggage. Bro. J.
Blomqvist tried to get
his ticket prolonged for
a few days, but it didn't
work. Looking back I visited
John Larsson, and then we
went to Lefgrens and from
there all went out to
my home in Farr West.

Stockholm Sweden Jan 11-1961
at 8:05 AM Richard who was just
released after filling 30 months
"mission" in Finland, boarded
the train for Kärgruva to
visit the Adalf Larsson
"Cousin" Adalf wrote us a
letter which we received in
Stockholm giving us the
schedule and directions
for reaching his home.

traveled into the country

11:10 AM - 11th

Our rail-buss - which we changed
to at Anglesberg arrived at Kärgruva
at a few minutes late, but we

were met at the stop by
"Cousin" Adolf Larsson, father's
own first cousin. He looked
about like Uncle Charlie he is
76 years old. He had a small
sled with a carrier on. We
had both protected Swoist a
and as we were greeted by
Adolph we said "Det Gläder
mig att se dig" (I am
