

Elizabeth Harris Powell is the mother of the mother of the father of the father of Jean Sabin Groberg. Elizabeth's history is one of intriguing and enigmatic obscurity. There are a whole lot of info as to when, where, and with whom Elizabeth was during her life with almost no explanation as to why or how she got to be there. The void of missing detail in her recorded history has led many diligent family history sleuthing descendants to try addressing those why and how details with questions, possible solutions, and even an occasional well-intended but unsourced declaration as if fact. But this life sketch does not weigh in on those detailed aspects of Elizabeth's history. It stands, rather, as a respectful bystander's testament to a stalwart woman who lived a remarkably long and difficult life—one full of faith, resilience, and statistical anomalies.

Elizabeth Harris Powell was born on October 12, 1821, in Llanover, Monmouthshire, Wales. Though many details surrounding her early life have been lost to the void of un-documented history, there are at least three points of data that have generally been accepted as true.

First: that Elizabeth's biological parents were named Mary Evans and John Harris. Though this is confirmed both by legal documentation and Elizabeth herself, the names "Mary Evans" and "John Harris" were exceedingly common in early 19th-century Wales, making it nearly impossible for any Harris/Powell history researchers to determine exactly which Mary Evans or John Harris actually contributed to Elizabeth's gene pool.

Second: that aside from giving birth to her, Mary Evans appears to have played no role in her daughter's life. Many records also suggest that Elizabeth's father was absent from her life, indicating she was not raised by either biological parent (despite both being alive at the time). The unusual circumstances of Elizabeth's upbringing

are further underscored by her omission of any mention of her parents from her personal records.

Third: that a certain 'John Harris of Llanover', acting as Elizabeth's guardian, made the rare but significant decision to send her to a girls' boarding school in England when she was 13 years old. In an era when fewer than 10% of European girls received any formal education at all, let alone one abroad and at a boarding school, this decision stands out as one of many life-altering anomalies in Elizabeth's early years.

Through a mutual friend at school, Elizabeth was introduced to John Powell, an English stonemason from Little Brampton, Herefordshire. Though eight years her senior, the two quickly formed a strong relationship made unique by yet another group of statistical anomalies.

First: Elizabeth and John eloped on November 13, 1840, when she was 19. This alone made their marriage unusual, since women then typically married around 23. Adding to the anomaly was the fact that the typical age gap at the time was 1.5 to 3 years—not eight.

Second: their first child was born two months after the wedding. In an era when most women bore their first child around a year after marriage, this would have likely been seen as a scandalous affair.

Third: At a time when teenage mothers were often met with social rejection, Elizabeth's grandfather welcomed the young couple and their child into his home. This unusually generous gesture of support likely provided them with more stability than they otherwise could have expected.

Even more striking than this kind act was the love and support Elizabeth received from her husband, John, who chose to not only remain with his young wife and child, but to upend his career and relocate to Wales.

A committed Methodist, Elizabeth involved herself deeply in her congregation, while John belonged to no specific church. Further proving his devotion, he agreed to lead the singing in the church choir.

The young family later moved so John could work at the Iron Works Mill. It was here they met the Huish family, who were members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Following a period of illness, in which Mrs. Helen Niblet Huish provided John with both care and reading material (including her "Mormon scriptures"), John made a sudden and solitary decision that would change the family forever.

As later recorded by his eldest daughter Mary, John excused himself during a family visit to "go and keep an appointment in the village."

He later returned with wet hair, announcing that he had been baptized a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"The remark was like setting a lighted match to a room of fire-damp. Mother was shocked. 'Why, John, would you join such a low degraded sect?' Some of our relatives scolded, some cursed, some cried. There was quite a commotion in our house."

Despite her initial resistance, Elizabeth chose to listen as John taught her the basic tenets of the "Mormon" church. Six weeks later, she was baptized, joining her husband in a religious community that comprised less than 0.5% of the Welsh population at the time.

Elizabeth's adult life was not only shaped by her conversion but also her role as a mother. She bore twelve children with John, ten of which survived infancy. In 1856, when their twelfth child was three months old, John was again stricken with Typhus. During his illness, he received a blessing from the missionaries, in which they promised him he would not only live to see the Utah territory, but would be blessed with the opportunity to use his skills as a stonecutter to work on the Salt Lake Temple.

Showing great faith and commitment, Elizabeth, John, and their many children left Wales for the Americas, traveling aboard the clipper ship Enoch Train then crossing the plains with the Edmund Ellsworth Handcart Company. They arrived in the Salt Lake Valley on September 26, 1856. Though still weakened from illness, John found enough strength to fulfill his priesthood blessing by going straight to work on the Salt Lake Temple. He died less than two weeks later, on October 9, 1856.

Left alone at 35, with ten children, Elizabeth nevertheless found the strength to carry on. Guided by faith and bound by maternal duty, she navigated the hardships of widowhood with the same self-sufficiency that likely governed her through childhood.

Much of Elizabeth Harris Powell's story remains a mystery. The absence of consistent records, the commonality of Welsh names, and the contradictions that fill genealogical platforms like FamilySearch have made it difficult to form

a clear and authoritative narrative. Theories proliferate, often with more imagination than evidence

But the facts we do have show that her life was not shaped by what she inherited, but rather by what she endured and created. Those descendants who have stepped in to fill the holes in her history have revealed not only certain facts about her life but also a deep desire to understand and honor the quiet resilience of a woman who, against all odds, persisted, adapted, and led her family into a new world, leaving behind an enduring testament of faith, family, and fortitude.

But her legacy is as much about what is missing as what is known, and in the absence of her own words (or the words of her parents), we are taught this vital truth: If you don't write your own account, others will write it for you.
